REQUESTS:

Sustain and Grow the Direct Support Professional Workforce

HF 382 | SF 402

Fully fund and implement regular adjustments to the Competitive Workforce Factor to reduce the wage gap that exists between DSPs and other occupations with similar training and education requirements.

Strengthen Mental Health.

HF 1005 | SF 1402

Implement rate increases that will maintain and improve access to service.

Expand Student Loan Debt Counseling.

Increase the existing grant to ensure more Minnesotans are equipped with the knowledge to manage debt and achieve financial wellness.
